LESSON 5: "Politics"/GRADES 9-12

Key Concept: Bacon and Beans and Limousines

In 1931, during the Great Depression, Rogers gave a radio broadcast entitled "Bacon, Beans, and Limousines," which is considered his most famous speech. "Bacon and Beans, and Limousines" proved to be one of the few times Will Rogers did not incorporate much humor into his performance due to the gravity of the topic and the economic downturn in America during this trying time in American history.

Will Rogers was encouraged and approached to run for political office. Though he never did choose to be a politician, he did play a pivotal role in the political arena throughout his adult life. His satirical wit and political commentary often scolded political leaders in a playful and humorous manner. It wasn't until the economic downturn of the Depression that Rogers steppe away from his role as entertainer and into the role of humanitarian. During this trying episode in American history, Rogers displayed characteristics of leadership and commitment that rivaled any political figure of his time.

Learning Objectives

- 1. Analyze the historical significance of Will Rogers' famous speech, "Bacon, Beans and Limousines."
- 2. Understand the importance of this speech in the career of Will Rogers as a political satirist versus a humanitarian
- 3. Recognize and articulate the impact the Great Depression had on the majority population during this trying time in American history
- 4. Compare and contrast contemporary satirists to Will Rogers as an agent of change who challenges political views and critiques policy makers and politicians through media.
- 5. Make connections between Will Rogers' radio broadcast "Bacon and Beans and Limousines" and contemporary issues of economic crisis in America.

Learning Activity: "The Economy During the Depression"

Using the supplied material in this lesson plan, students will be asked to estimate the price of various products during the Depression in 1930. Then, students will estimate the cost of those same items in 2024. After the students have completed this portion of the activity worksheet, the instructor will provide the actual cost of the items using the answer key included in this lesson plan. As an instructor, you are encouraged to engage students in a conversation regarding their findings as well as what surprised them when comparing their estimates with the actual cost values. Then, students should complete the questions on the "Then and Now" worksheet, using the knowledge obtained from the activity. Because some of these questions are discussion based, instructors should grade students based upon their participation, thoughtfulness, and creativity in addition to their overall comprehension of the lesson material.
